

Our Best To You




"Our Best To You" is a song learned by MacMurray Women dating back to the late 1940s. It has been sung at various occasions throughout the school year in different settings, depending upon the era of the College. The song was sung beginning in the late '40s by the senior women at the Green Ribbon Ceremony, a rite of initiation for freshman women dating back to 1928. "Our Best to You" was also sung at "pinnings," a late night ritual held in the dorms wherein a MacMurray woman announced her pinning (fraternity pin), lavaliere or engagement.

As a final goodbye, the women of the College gathered in a circle on the front lawn of the Chapel and wished each other a good and happy life by singing "Our Best to You" following the Commencement ceremony. Later, as MacMurray graduates, male and female would marry, fellow classmates would encircle them at some point during the wedding reception and the women of the group would lead the Mac alums in "Our Best to You."

In singing "Our Best to You" today, Class of 2020 graduates will be joined by alumni from across the decades as we bid a fond farewell to MacMurray by gathering in this cherished tradition one last time on Annie Merner Chapel lawn.

Our best to you, may your dreams come true. May old Father Time never be unkind. And through the years save your smiles and tears, they are souvenirs. They make music in your heart. Remember this. each new day's a kiss sent from up above with an angel's love. So here's to you, may your skies be blue, and your love blest. That's our best to you!



Cynthia Zahm Siegfried '68

Doctor of Humane Letters



Cynthia Zahm Siegfried came to MacMurray College from Madison High School in Madison, Illinois. At MacMurray, she was involved in many, many activities, including Madrigals and other musical pursuits. She received a bachelor's degree in psychology from MacMurray College in 1968. She met her husband, Jim Siegfried, a fellow classmate, at MacMurray, and the two were wed shortly after graduation.

Following the birth of their daughters, Cyndi, Jim and their young family moved to the suburban Memphis, Tennessee area, where she resides today, and she threw herself heart and soul into raising their girls.

When her husband was diagnosed with stage 4 cancer in 2002, she approached his diagnosis with the same intensity that she put into parenting. As an avid reader, she delved into every book or medical journal on lung cancer, caregiving, managing stress in chronic illness, and nutritional rehabilitation after surgery and chemotherapy. She became an expert in these areas.

Cyndi supported her husband through 10 recurrences of lung cancer over 16 years. As she cared for him, her emails to friends and family to keep them apprised of the emotional aspects of the ordeal grew into a blog and that evolved into her book, "Cancer Journey: A Caregiver's View from the Passenger Seat," which was released in 2009. The book was listed as the #1 best seller for Cancer Support on Amazon in 2010.

After the publishing the book, Cyndi and Jim hit the speaking circuit, providing help and hope for individuals facing catastrophic life events. She continued to write as a freelance writer, contributing to periodicals and publications such as: Significant Living, In Touch, Chicken Soup for the Soul, Coping with Cancer, Today's Caregiver, Nostalgia, A New Heart, Today's Christian, and Breast Cancer Wellness Magazine.

In 2003 Cyndi and Jim founded f.a.i.t.H—facing an illness through Him, a support group for caregivers and their loved ones facing cancer. This group has helped hundreds of people through local meetings and online support.

Since 2003 Cyndi has been an ardent advocate for lung cancer awareness and for cancer caregivers. Based on reader contributions, she was selected as the 2011 Caregiver of the Year by Lungevity, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the treatment and prevention of lung cancer.

Cyndi is now a popular speaker who offers hope and inspiration to those touched by catastrophic disease and uses her degree from MacMurray College to help others through these challenging health situations. Sadly, Jim succumbed to his lung cancer diagnosis in 2018, three days before their 50^{th} wedding anniversary.


